About the College

The Government Model Degree College in Diblong was established by the Government of Assam to promote higher education for the people of Dima Hasao. Located in the village of Diblong near Hatikhali in Dima Hasao district, the college is approximately 92 km from the district headquarters in Haflong and around 27 km from Lumding in Hojai district. The foundation stone of the college was laid on November 8, 2020, by Debolal Garlosa, Chief Executive Member of the NC Hills Autonomous Council, along with Nandita Garlosa, Executive Member and in charge of higher education, NC Hills Autonomous Council. Since its inception, the college has been mentored by Maibang Degree College, Maibang. Faculty members across various departments were appointed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Assam, in July 2023.

COURSES OFFERED:

The College offers courses of studies leading to BA (Three/ Four Year Degree course both in General and Honours Courses. The course is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar and is governed by the rules and regulations of the University. The courses comprise of Six/ Eight Semesters of Six months' duration each. The Degree is awarded on successful completion of Six/Eight semesters having passed in Six/Eight End semester examinations conducted by Assam University.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO 1st SEMESTER OF B.A:

For seeking admission to the first semester of B.A a candidate must have passed Higher Secondary Examination or equivalent 10+2 Standard of Council/ Board recognized by the State/ Central government authorities.

NUMBER OF SEATES IN FIRST SEMESTER:

There are only 250 seats in the College

COURSE STRUCTURE SUBJECTS AND COMBINATIONS FYUG:

FYUG- Bachelor of Arts (B.A.):

a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Subjects:

Economics, Assamese, Education, English, History and Political Science.

b) Discipline Specific Minor (DSC) Subjects:

Economics, Assamese, Education, English, History and Political science.

c) Inter- Disciplinary Courses(DSM) Subjects:

Economics, Assamese, Education, English, History and Political Science.

- d) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): 1. General English, Alternative English and Communicative English (AECC) 2. Modern Indian Language (MIL)-Assamese (ASML)
- e) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) Subjects:

Economics, Education, Assamese, English, History and Political Science

f) Value Added Courses (VAC) Subjects: NCC/NSS and Understanding India

A students has to take total 7 papers i.e. three core courses, one multidisciplinary course, one value added course, one skill enhancement course and one ability enhancement course.

College Uniform:

The Govt. Model Degree College has a uniform dress code for both boys and grils.

Boys: White Shirt, Grey Trouser, Grey Tie, Black shoes and White Socks.

Girls: Grey Salwar, White Kameez, Grey Dupatta, (V- Shape with 6 inches plate), Black footwear and White Socks.

College uniform is compulsory for all students and no other dress will be allowed within the college premises.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library has been modernized with SOUL software and fully digitized. It offers ample space and comfortable accommodations for reading. The collection of books is adequate to cover the subjects taught at the college. Additionally, several key newspapers, periodicals, journals, and magazines, both online and in print, are regularly subscribed to. A digital library with Wi-Fi access is also available for the convenience of faculty and students. Library opening Hours are as follows:

The Primary guidelines regarding the implementation of NEP 2020 for Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) by Assam University are the following:

Primary Guidelines for implementation of NEP 2020 for UG courses of colleges affiliated to Assam University, Silchar.

In order to implement NEP 2020 from the session 2023-24 for UG courses in affiliated colleges following primary guidelines will be followed

- 1. UG curriculum for colleges affiliated to Assam University shall be a four year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in Annexure-I. Option for lateral exit shall be free from additional 04 credit earning. In lieu of Project / Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Course which will be equal to 12 credits in total. However, students opting for project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree. It is decided that in their respective prospectus each college should categorically mention this. It is also resolved that all those three papers (DSC-452,453 and 454) should be of level 500.
- 2. Offering Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) programme is mandatory for all affiliated colleges. However, the colleges/ Departments shall have liberty if Honours with Research be offered or not depending upon their infrastructural limitation. If Honours with Research is not offered in a particular college, respective prospectus should clearly mention this to avoid confusion amongst students.
- Interdisciplinary courses shall have 04 baskets viz; Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semester. Bunching of subjects in each basket shall be as per Annexure-II.
- 4. From Discipline Specific Minor students shall take two subjects related to his /her Discipline. Each such subject should of 50% of total credit allotted to this course. Viz; for Three Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits. Assam University shall notify cluster of subjects from which Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) can be chosen. To be more precise it is decided that DSM 101(3), DSM -201 (4), DSM -251(3) and DSM-301(3) = 13 credits should be the first minor subjects in case of Three Year UG Programme (TYUG) and DSM-151 (3) DSM -252 (3), DSM-DSM-302 (3) and DSM-351(4) =13 should be second minor subject. For FYUG Programme DSM -401 (4) should be first minor subject and DSM -451(4) should be second minor subject.

- 5. Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/her core course once only, after completion of second semester. However, if a candidate desires to make one of his/her minors to core then automatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
- 6. 7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student up to 3rd year for opting Honours with Research Degree in 4th year. However, for only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4th year in any case.
- Evaluation of 3 and 4 credit courses shall be out of 100 marks and that for 2 credit course shall be out of 50 marks.
- IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
- For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.
- 10. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM. Evaluation method for SEC for Science stream shall be 50 (End Semester Theory)+30 (End Sem Practical/Project/Field work) + 20 (internal test of which 14 for test and 6 for attendance). The same for Arts and commerce shall be 50 (End Semester Theory)+20 (End Semester Practical/Project/Field work) + 30 (internal test of which 20 for test and 10 for attendance).
- 11. For EVS (VAC-151) evaluation method shall be 70 (End Semester exam) + 30 Internal/Assignment. Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- Evaluation method for VAC -101 (with practical) shall be same as that of SEC (with practical) and that of VAC-101 (Without practical) shall be same as VAC-151.
- EVS in VAC-151 should be of 100 level and EVS included in Natural Science Basket as IDC should be of 200 level.
- 14. Publication / Presentation of papers out of Research Project/ Dissertation carried out in VIII semester is not mandatory. However, the project shall have to be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner during end semester examination. Total marks for the project shall be 300 of which 90

Out of 90 marks as internal, in case of Dissertation/Project, there shall be three progress reviews and each review shall be of 30 marks. Marks obtained by a student in each of the review shall be notified immediately. Review of progress shall be done by concerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.

- 15. For all other courses evaluation method shall be of 70 marks (for End Semester Examination) and 30 marks (for Internal Examination). Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
- 16. Natural Science in IDC, shall not have any practical component.
- 17. For Subjects with practical's DSC -152, DSC -253, DSC -303, DSC-354 and DSC -404 shall be practical with 100 marks. Practical examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
- 18. For Subjects with practical DSM -251 shall be practical for first minor and DSM -351 shall be practical for second minor. Marks for practical examination shall be 100 each and examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
- 19. For VAC 151 (EVS), shall not have any practical component.
- 20. For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. DSC from one cluster and DSM from other cluster is not allowed. DSC, DSM and IDC cannot be the same subject.
- 21. All DSM courses shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice keeping total requirement of 17 credit for each minor but they cannot change the code of minor papers. viz; One student of Physics (Core) may have Chemistry as first minor in DSM 101 and Mathematics as second minor in DSM 151. But the other student of Physics (core) may have Mathematics as first minor in DSM-101 and Chemistry as second minor in DSM 151.
- 22. For Research with Honours students, DSC-451 paper shall be research methodology and content of this course shall be same across the subjects and across the disciplines. However, for other students, DSC 451 will be a usual 500 level paper.
- Any student interested to opt for Honours with Research should have 7.5 CGPA up to third year without any arrear.
- 24. In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. Admission to the College is through online process only in the prescribed Application Form available in the website of Samarthhttps://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in
- 2. Notice prescribing the last date of Admission is hung up in the college notice board and college website usually a few days before or after the declaration of the result of the qualifying examination.
- 3. The Admission Form must be filled in completely in all respects and the hard copy of the Application must be submitted with the supporting documents. Incomplete Form(s) will be rejected straightway.
- 4. Admission process is conducted under the direct control of the Admission committee. In case of admission to the 'Honours Course, the rules of Assam University and the decision of the concerned department will be binding.
- 5. Admission is strictly on merit and is governed by the admission rules framed by the ADMISSION Committee. The decision of the chairperson of the admission Committee stands final.
- 6. Any under pressure or interference in the matter (s) of admission will be treated as disqualification.
- 7. The self-attested copies of the following documents (two Copies each) are to be furnished along with the hardcopy Application Form:
 - Mark Sheet, Certificate, Admit Card and Registration Card of HSLC
 - Character Certificate.
 - SC/ST/OB/MOBC Certificate.
 - Permanent Residential Certificate.
 - Gap certificate from appropriate authority in case the student who passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year.
 - Original Migration/Transfer Certificate for the students seeking admission other than in the 1st Semester.
 - Latest passport size photograph. (4 copies)
 - 8. The original copies of the attested documents must be produced before the Admission Committee.
 - 9. Presence of the Candidate on the date of interview/admission before the Admission Committee is compulsory.
 - 10. The fees (if there be any) for admission must be paid on the date of admission after the approval from the Admission Committee.
 - 11. No request for admission will be entertained after the prescribed date(s) fixed by the authorities concerned.
 - 12. There is reservation of seats for the student belonging to SC, ST (P), ST (H), OBC (including MOBC) and physically Handicapped (PH) categories as per Government rules. Valid certificate issued by the competent authority must be produced in original before the

Admission Committee on the date of admission and the Xerox Copy must be attached with the Application Forms. The reservation of seats is as follows:

- 13. Admission in other semesters i.e. 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th will be completed within 7 days after completion of the earlier end semester examinations on provisional basis. The provisional admission is to be regularized (for those who fulfil the eligibility conditions of the University) within seven days from the publication of the results of the earlier semester.
- 14. Request for the permission for late admission shall not be entertained.

ADMISSION FEE STRUCTURE (FOR THE SESSION 2024-25)

The admission fee structure is notified by the Principal following the direction of the Government of Assam issued from time to time. The Registration and Examination Fees of the Assam University are to be paid during online application for the same.

COLLEGE TRANSFER/PROVISIONAL PASS CERTIFICATE

For a pass certificate/transfer certificate one has to apply two days ahead along with the following clearance certificates:

- 1. Fee clearance certificate from the college office.
- 2. Library clearance certificate.
- 3. NCC/NSS clearance certificate.
- 4. Clearance certificate from student Union Office
- 5. Surrender of college Identity Card (only in case of transfer certificate).
- 6. Clearance certificate from the hostel (if hostel boarder)

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTANCE OF DISCIPLINE THE COLLEGE

- 1. The college lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. The rules and the regulations of the college are binding to all students of the college.
- 2. Only such individuals, societies or Association as have been recognised/approved by the Principal, shall have the facilities to the College premises.
- 3. At the time of admission, the students and the parents/ guardians are required to furnished an undertaking in respect of the student' regular attendance in the class and appearance in the college and university examination as per guidelines/ instructions as specified by the concerned authorities.

- 4. The rules concerning the attendance in the class of the students are strictly maintained in accordance to the instruction of Assam University, Silchar which is notified by the college authority at the beginning of the academic session. The rules for non-collegiate and discollegiate will be strictly adhered to.
- 5. The rules concerning college examination are strictly accorded to the Examination Committee of the college. And for the university examinations the eligibility conditions and instructions of the university will be strictly followed.
- 6. The following activities of the students in this college will be treated as serious offences. All powers for disciplinary actions against the offences are vested with the Principal and the Academic Committee of the College and their decision shall be final in all such matters.
 - Encouraging and participating in ragging of any types.
 - Forcible disruption of class.
 - Destruction of college properties.
 - Misbehaviour shown towards girls, women, teachers and employees of the college.
 - Uses of drugs, alcohol, narcotics, smoking inside the college campus.
 - Providing any wrong information to the college authority.
 - Damaging and losing of library books of the college.
 - And any other activities that may detriment the academic atmosphere of the college
- 7. Students are to keep the photo-identity card of the college with them in the college premises and they may have to produce it on demand. The identity cards shall be made available to the students within 15 days from the date of admission. The identity Cards are to be renewed in each academic year. The old identity cards are to be submitted for renewal at the beginning of the new academic year. Loss of identity card must be reported to the college office immediately and applied for a duplicate one with proper documentation and cost.
- 8. College uniform for the students is a must while they are in the college campus during routine hours (excepts for NCC/NSS/cultural/ sports practices/ activities)
- 9. Use of mobile phone by the students within the classrooms, examination halls and in any of the meetings of the college is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Students' union will be strictly guided by the constitution of the Govt. Model Degree College, Diblong Students' Union and such instructions that college authority may notify from time to time.
- 11. Any notices desired to be pasted or circulated by the GMDCSU or any individual students anywhere in the college premises shall require the approval of the principal.
- 12. All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal and his/her decision shall be final in all such matters.
